Denial – R17-0008 John X. Lucente (Terry Industrial Park)
WHEREAS, John X. Lucente requests a rezoning of 1.9998 acres from Rural (RU) to Industrial 2 (I-2) with proffers to allow certain uses permitted in the I-2 zoning district. The proposed use is a heavy equipment and specialized vehicle sale, rental and/or service establishment. The property is located at 8332 Jeffersion Davis Hwy. The property is located within the Highway Corridor Overlay District and the Primary Development Boundary. The property is identified for Employment Center development on the Future Land Use Map of the Comprehensive Plan. Tax parcel 49B-1-5. Berkeley Voting District; and
WHEREAS , staff has reviewed the subject application and recommends approval of the rezoning with proffers as stated in the staff report and executive summary; and
WHEREAS , the Spotsylvania County Planning Commission held a public hearing on November 15, 2017, duly advertised in a local newspaper for a period of two weeks, and interested citizens were given an opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS , the Spotsylvania County Board of Supervisors held a public hearing on February 13, 2017, duly advertised in a local newspaper for a period of two weeks, and interested citizens were given an opportunity to be heard; and
WHEREAS, the general welfare and good zoning practice are served by denial of the application.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Spotsylvania County Board of Supervisors does hereby deny R17-0008 John X. Lucente (Terry Industrial Park).
