Public Sector Construction Market Conditions

- 15% to 20% market increase
 - Downey & Scott LLC. (2017)
- Contributing Factors
 - Labor shortages
 - Excess public project volume
 - Selective bidding and higher margins
 - Less competition vs. number of projects
 - Increase in material pricing
- Projected Construction Inflation Index
 - 5% annually

Animal Shelter Expansion

- 11,000 s.f. addition
- Renovation
- Security updates
- 95% Design Plans
 - Under code review
- Construction bidding
 - April, 2018
 - 18 month construction





Animal Housing-Expansion

- Larger Kennel Size: 4' x 6' vs. 6' x 6'
- 3 Visitation Rooms; currently have none
- 4 Real Life Rooms (2 for Dogs + 2 for Cats)
- Better Floor Finishes in Animal Areas for disease control and cleaning
- Increased dog capacity
- 3 puppies kennels; currently have none
- Increased cat capacity

Animal Housing-Renovation

- 5 Court Case Dog Runs: these animals have long stays and need larger runs in order to stay healthy; currently have none
- Reconfigure existing space to better utilize square footage and have proper separation of animals (health, length of stay, promoting adoption)
- Better Floor Finishes in Animal Areas for disease control and cleaning
- Maintains current cat capacity
- Replacement of existing kenneling existing kenneling is deteriorating

Updated Animal Shelter Budget

- Original Budget
 - \$3.79 million
- Expanded Budget
 - \$4.79 million
- Project Cost Estimate
 - February, 2017
 - \$4,770,500 (2017 dollars)
 - February, 2018
 - \$6,272,870 (2019 dollars)
- Budget Increase
 - 32% over projected
 - Two year inflation
 - Market conditions and scope refinement to renovation

- Expenditure to date
 - \$356,140
- Current Fund Balance
 - \$3,433,859
- Future Expenditures
 - \$5,950,000
- Potential Shortfall
 - \$2,516,141
 - Including \$1,000,000 previously authorized




Updated Judicial Center Budget

 - 20 to 25 years old
 - wall and ceiling removal
- Complete prior to space usage
- Building C
 - \$1.2 million
- Building A&B
 - \$1.6 million

 - historic courthouse stabilization
 - HVAC/electrical
- Expected bidding
 - March, 2018

- Allows Judicial Center Project to progress



Marshall Center Bathrooms

- Existing Plumbing
 - water quality/flow
 - subject to failure
- Existing stalls
 - Do not meet code
 - Granite partitions



- Functionality
 - Stall heights and width
 - No counter space
 - No sound attenuation
 - Limited hot water
 - Student design use
- Requires renovation
 - Mandated ADA compliance

Bathroom Options


- Aesthetic Improvement
 - Paint walls
 - Restore/paint partitions
 - Replacement of fixtures as-is (subject to staining)
 - Free standing counter
 - \$5,000 each

Courthouse Sidewalk Rehabilitation


- Maintenance project
