Summary: Spotsylvania County received \$260,253 in Victim Witness funding versus the \$255,150 that was anticipated with the adoption of the FY 2019 budget. The Commonwealth Attorney's Office requests to appropriate the additional \$5,103 to supplement the Victim Witness program budget as these funds cannot be used to supplant local funds. The Commonwealth Attorney's Office wishes to allocate the additional funding for the Victim/Witness program as follows disability insurance for \$720, language line interpretive services for \$100, mileage for \$858, subsistence and lodging for \$512, education and training for \$1,000, memberships for \$100, and office supplies for \$1,813.
