Essex County solar farm sediment runoff is 'an enforcement case'

ESSEX COUNTY, Va. -- The tons of muddy runoff escaping into the watershed below the new Essex County Solar Power Center is "an active enforcement case that will result in financial penalties," said a spokesperson with the state Department of Environmental Quality.

Last night <u>we showed you</u> part of Sunday's sediment runoffs from the 200-acre project by Coronal Energy of California just off Tidewater Trail and Muddy Gut Road. That 20-megawatt solar field will feed Dominion Energy's grid.

The runoffs have been "severe," said Wyn Davis, Essex County Building Official and Environmental Compliance Officer. "There's not a soul in the county happy about this."

The problem is clear. What went wrong isn't.



The Department of Environmental Quality, which approved the design plan, will be investigating, said DEQ spokeswoman Ann Regn.

"Our regional office is monitoring the situation closely," she said in a statement. (See full statement below.)

DEQ has issued multiple notices of violations in August and September, she said, and more are expected for more recent discharges into wetlands and streams.

The key contractor on the Coronal Energy project, McCarthy Building Companies, is doing all it can to fix the situation, Davis said.

He believes an issue was bulldozing retention ponds in preparation to finishing the project - before the planted native vegetation had grown.

An updated statement from Coronal Energy Friday (see full statement below) said unexpected weather conditions prevented the vegetation from growing in sloped areas.

Sediment control and cleanup measures are in full gear, the statement said.

The runoff has impacted Muddy Gut Creek, which feeds into the nearby Rappahannock - all protected by the Chesapeake Bay Act.

Lifelong nearby resident Gary McCauley, 63, said he's never seen anything like it.

"Never," he said. "Not in my whole lifetime. Even after a hurricane."

The sediment runoff will have to be cleaned up, said Davis with Essex County. The project has a \$396,000 sediment control bond, he added.

More developments are expected in this case, including heavy rain forecast for this weekend.

Friday's statement from DEQ:

"This is an active enforcement case that will result in financial penalties. Our regional office is monitoring the situation closely. DEQ has issued multiple notices of violations (NOVs) from both the stormwater construction program and Virginia Water Protection permit program for discharges into wetlands and streams in August and September 2017. There is a proposed consent order out for public comment that includes \$9100 in civil charges to resolve noncompliance with the construction general permit. Another NOV is expected to be issued next week for erosion and sedimentation impacts that occurred in January caused by the removal of sediment traps for final grading."

Joint statement from Coronal Energy and McCarthy Building Companies:

"As leading renewable energy companies, Coronal Energy and McCarthy Building Companies are committed to delivering projects in an environmentally responsible way which entails months of planning and coordination with county and state agencies.

As with all of our solar projects, a Sediment and Erosion Control Plan and a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan were prepared by a 3rd party engineer located in the state of Virginia. The plans were then submitted and approved by the state of Virginia prior to the start of construction. The Stormwater Pollution Prevention plan was verified in place by a state certified 3rd party stormwater consultant with expertise in the local geography. This same consultant conducted site inspections as required by the State.

Best Management Practices (BMPs) were installed on the project as a means of dealing with sediment control. BMPs involving temporary sediment containment measures included: sediment traps, silt fence, diversion ditches, check dams and temporary basins to manage sediment runoff at the site. Temporary sediment control measures were put into place throughout the construction of the project, but were compromised due to the ground becoming over-saturated and heavier than normal rainfall.

At the start of construction, meetings were held with the county inspector regarding implementation of the plan and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) began regular inspections. Over the term of the project's construction, DEQ provided feedback and the project team worked to meet their requests. Upon substantial completion of the project, steps were taken to stabilize the soil as called out in the plans; however, due to high volumes of rain and snow these efforts were expanded upon and additional recommendations will be provided following an inspection by another 3rd party engineer who specializes in sediment control. This inspection will occur the week of 2/12.

Typically, the most effective sediment control mechanism is re-generation of native vegetation. Although the site was seeded with native vegetation, which has been growing in the flat areas of the site where the trackers are located, conditions prevented it from growing in the sloped areas where over-saturation, cold weather and heavier than normal rainfall is having an impact.

We will re-seed again, but warmer weather is required for full germination, therefore the temporary sediment control measures are being expanded and clean-up efforts are in full-gear to help manage sediment run-off at the site. And, additional efforts will be implemented based upon the recommendations that are received following the inspection by the engineer next week.

Additional temporary measures are continuing to be installed and maintained on an on-going basis, and are happening in advance of next week's site evaluation."





EDITORIAL: Solar project is too big for Spotsylvania

AFTER meeting with both sides and reviewing reams of docu- ments, we've determined that the rancorous year-long debate over a proposed 6,350-acre solar power plant that has pitted Concerned Citizens of Spotsylvania County, a small local grassroots group, against a large, out-of-state corporation comes down to this: the project is way too big for western Spotsylvania County, and there are too few benefits to county residents to offset this major deficiency.

Utah-based Sustainable Power Group (sPower) wants to turn 10 square miles of agriculturally-zoned land that was previously a tree farm into a forest of solar panels, making it the largest solar facility on the East Coast. The company's plan to shield this utility-sized power plant from view with trees and berms doesn't change the fact that it is massive in scale.

Too massive, in fact, for an agricultural zone that abuts a residential area. Which is why the county's Planning Commission recommended that sPower be given a special use permit to erect solar panels only on 245 acres, the smallest of its three connecting sites and also the one farthest away from homes.

Some objections to the 500-megawatt, \$615 million project, including nearby residents' fears that the proposed solar facility would cause major environmental and health problems during construction and its subsequent 30 years of operation, seem somewhat overblown, and more attributable to a Not In My Backyard attitude that is making it harder and harder to erect needed infrastructure pretty much anywhere.

Both sides have hired appraisers who disagree on what impact the solar farm would have on nearby home values, but it seems beyond dispute that solar panels would be quiet, undemanding neighbors. sPower has also committed to spending \$25 million in community upgrades, including replacing aging water pipes in Fawn Lake, although the company admits that these enticements are not legally enforceable.

But sPower's resistance to posting a cash bond or irrevocable letter of credit to protect Spotsylvania taxpayers from what could be an enormous cost of decommissioning and disposing of 1.8 million solar panels containing toxic cadmium telluride at the end of their useful lifespans if the project's multiple

limited liability corporations skip out is troubling. So is its insistence that the supposed future recycling value of the spent panels three decades from now be included in its current decommissioning plan.

Related to the project's massive scale—in an area that is much closer to a residential area than most of the nation's solar facilities of its size—is the fact that sPower has already contracted to sell all of the electricity generated by the proposed Spotsylvania solar facility to power-guzzling tech giants Apple and Microsoft, as well as the University of Richmond.

Microsoft, which already has a data center in Loudoun County, is utilizing tax breaks and a \$1.5 million state grant to expand in Mecklenburg County. The expansion will add 100 more jobs, but they'll all be in Southside, not Spotsylvania.

sPower points to millions of dollars of increased tax revenues the land would generate as a solar plant instead of a tree farm, with no corresponding pressure on county services that a residential subdivision in that same location would create. But a tree farm and a suburban subdivision are not the only options there.

Dr. Dean Bellas of Alexandria-based Urban Analytics, who was hired by Concerned Citizens to analyze the economic impact of the proposed solar farm, noted that "under the sPower proposal, Spotsylvania County will receive declining tax revenues annually on a per-acre basis on an appreciating asset (real estate)."

Bellas concluded that "the forgone tax revenues to Spotsylvania County from alternative development scenarios are substantial... The County would also enjoy larger economic benefits (new jobs, new labor income, and the multiplier effect on the local economy) with less acreage needed."

Bottom line: If Microsoft or Apple were building a new data center in Spotsylvania County and creating high-paying jobs there, a good case could be made for building such a large solar facility alongside to power it. But that's not the case. All of the electricity produced, and most of the jobs the project will support after a brief construction period, will be elsewhere.

Even under a best-case scenario with no adverse impacts on local residents, Spotsylvania County will forgo the possibility of more lucrative economic development in the area for a 30-year deal that will mostly benefit sPower and two of the largest corporations in the world. Property taxes and a \$25 million good-faith gesture are not enough to offset the potential loss of new jobs, future economic development and the increased tax revenue it would bring, and the loss of thousands of acres of agricultural land.

Solar power can and should be part of Virginia's energy mix, but this project is too big and offers too few benefits to the county. The Board of Supervisors should follow the Planning Commission's recommendation and grant sPower a special use permit only on the smallest of the three parcels.

Dear Board Members, I give you a lot of credit for hanging in there past 1am on 3/13. Past that, I'm astounded by the lack of scheduling coordination with the School Board. We ended up watching you from home.

Here are some observations you may not appreciate, but need to receive nevertheless:

- The second of your two segments was introduced by Wanda to review the agenda and some important items. Some of her first words were....voting on the SUP applications has been moved to 4/30 by the applicant. *Really?* Who sets the agenda here? Don't believe me? Review the tape. After over 15 months of debate and deep analyses by the Planning Commission, the jury should be in. *What were the criteria for extending this date to 4/30*?
- You were all provided copies of a table of sPower SUP concerns for the discussion that were amended with an extra column by Concerned Citizens. At least one Board Member demonstrated he had copies of it. The decision not to use the amended document to reflect *all* concerns for discussion demonstrated a bias toward sPower.
- Mr. Ross opened a motion for the Board to agree with the Planning Commission to eliminate Cadmium Telluride Panels as a condition of SUP approval. This was objected to by Mr. Skinner on the basis that he had no time to review the material and that in the absence of that he did not want to 'tarnish' the reputation of the company

providing the panels. Interesting. It's my understanding that all Board members were provided that same information at the same time. Beyond that I find it **'Goofy'** that any Board member would not put the safety of the County residents as a paramount priority. Actually it's more than just alarming, it's appalling if not shameful. This topic has been hotly debated for 15 months.

- sPower's 'expert' provided interesting 'testimony' on soil sample testing but in spite of the ongoing requests from Dave Hammond to provide specific documentation/data on soil sample testing, none has been provided. Why? The expert's testimony needs to be backed up by unaltered data. It's imperative it be provided before voting. You should have plenty of time now that the voting date has been pushed back to 4/30.
- Beyond all of this hyperventilation, I need to make one simple point. As on Ch 9, if approved, the power generated by the sPower solar farm will go to Microsoft, Amazon, Univ of Richmond. Charlie Payne said so, plain and simple. We get no direct benefit whatsoever. The casual observer would never realize this from the clever radio ads being sponsored by sPower. We would allow 3500 of 6500 acres of prime agricultural land to be castrated for industrial use without the appropriate re-zoning, and in the end if the project fails the County will likely get screwed. I flew over the areas today that have already been timbered. It's a frightening sight. The aspect of no direct benefit coupled with the risk of failure should be enough to generate denials of each SUP application. As we saw last night, the magnitude of this experiment may be beyond the collective abilities of the County to manage both during construction and operation. It's just that simple. One last thought as your respective terms expire, what will be your legacy?

To the extent that your decision on these SUPs is dependent on Mr. Creamer's Dec 3rd letter, I respectfully suggest that your confidence is misplaced – these promises cannot be enforced. This letter promises \$25 million over the 40 year life of the project. I challenge the Supervisors or staff to provide similar examples where a developer made a similar UNENFORCEABLE promise of funding at this level and followed through on it (not a proffer or other enforceable requirement). This is unprecedented. Has this ever happened in Spotsylvania County or nearby localities?

Since this massive utility project doesn't stand on its own merits, Mr. Creamer has decided to attempt to buy SUP approval with an unenforceable promissory note. He is merely shifting the Board's attention from the huge risks, including financial risks, by offering very tenuous UNENFORCEABLE promises to those who will listen.

Is the Board willing to provide the auditable, accountable and enforceable documentation to the public that specifies exactly how, by who, and when each and every element of the sPower CEO's promises will be delivered – over the life of this project?

I recommend you consider this information as sPower continues to canvas Supervisors to determine what it will take to secure your vote.

Do you trust them? We don't because of their duplicity on whether or not they are purchasing land from NTS, because of their quiet attempt to uprate their PJM connection which was only withdrawn after citizens discovered it and because of their acceptance of certain conditions after the Planning Commission vote (no burning and no CdTe panels) before switching to opposing those conditions. Finally these are some of the many questions that should be answered before proceeding to accept promises from Mr. Creamer:

- Does the attached information and points noted above make you comfortable with accepting this arrangement?
- What is the arrangement? In what form? Verbal? Written?
- What are you not telling the public about other promises from sPower?
- What would happen if (all very reasonable scenarios):
 - Mr. Creamer is unable to continue to serve as CEO for whatever reason and steps down? The letter gets thrown in his trashcan as he walks out the door.
 - sPower comes under financial pressure because of their exposure to the PG&E contracts and is forced to tighten their belts for a few years resulting in a freeze in payments. What if they can't start them back up again? This essentially puts the county in the solar business and subject to the ups and downs of that industry.
 - What happens when sPower sells the project to Dominion or another utility or investment group? New owners will not honor a letter signed by a long gone CEO.
 - What if AES, AIMCo and Ullico (owners of sPower) decide that they're not receiving the desired return on their investment from sPower and let Mr. Creamer go in favor of a new cost cutting CEO who won't recognize an UNENFORCEABLE letter from his predecessor?
- In reference to these promises, Mr. Payne stated at the March 12 public hearing that the items in the Creamer letter of Dec 3rd were suggestions and it would be "up to the county to make that determination" as to allocation of those funds.
- How will those funds (if they appear) be allocated and when since they will be provided "over the life of the project."?
- Which districts will benefit the most?
- Will the Supervisors be making these decisions in private or in public?
- Will the allocation of these phantom funds be subject to change after the next BOS elections?
- Is it worth risking the public welfare and financial health of the citizens of the Livingston District on a promise of the CEO of a company you had never heard of until 14 months ago?

Supervisors,

Since you will likely be discussing decommissioning at tomorrow's hearing, I feel it's important to provide a short summary of sPower's recent change in position on this important topic. I won't repeat the analysis of recycling costs that I sent you two weeks ago – it is included at the end of this email.

- SPower's decommissioning plan includes a total credit of \$25.7 million for "recycling." Their plan defines recycling as "material will be reconstituted into a new product." The cost estimate does not include any landfill option.
- Their plan also identifies the recycling companies who would perform this recycling all SEIA approved: First Solar, Dynamic Life Cycle Innovations, Cleanlites Recycling, and Clean Harbors. As outlined in my earlier email, there are significant <u>costs</u> associated with recycling the PV panels based on written quotes from these recycling companies.
- CCSC, county staff and the county's consultant (Dewberry) pushed back strongly on their recycling claims and both the PC's and staff's conditions <u>prohibit credit for recycling</u>.
- Last week, sPower forwarded an email to the county staff stating that it is now their intention to <u>landfill</u> <u>the panels</u> which is specifically prohibited in both the PC and staff conditions (SUP condition A.19.b).
- These panels contain cadmium, tellurium, lead, silver, indium etc

Now that sPower has been exposed - no one will pay them to recycle these panels as claimed - they are changing their entire approach for decommissioning to one of landfilling all 1.8 million panels (including the Cadmium Telluride – if those types of panels are not prohibited).

I strongly encourage the Supervisors to dismiss this latest attempt to ruin our environment and health and to maintain the <u>PC approved and staff recommended conditions of no credit for recycling and the prohibition on landfilling of these panels</u>. I also recommend a surety of \$67 million as detailed below to cover the current costs of recycling all of these panels.

I will be available during tomorrow's public hearing to provide further details on my discussions with sPower's recycling companies, the Electric Power Research Institute and other experts in this field who have not been made available to you by sPower.

The staff reports for today's Public Hearings on sPower's three SUPs provide notification that sPower would like credit given for recycling value in the decommissioning and bonding conditions. CCSC recommends strongly against modifying the PC approved (and the staff recommended) conditions to provide credit for recycling value.

After extensive research over the last year and a report from the county's consultant (Dewberry), the staff recommended that the Planning Commission provide no credit for recycling values. The Planning Commission agreed and included that provision several times in their approved conditions. From the staff report for SUP18-0001, Page 18: <u>"Since recycling values and costs in the future is unknown, no credit is permitted in the current conditions."</u>

Summary (details below):

- 1) Recycling of panels cost \$\$. The minimum value of \$36.7 million that the Planning Commission and staff have established should be significantly higher because there is a cost to recycle solar panels. The decommissioning cost estimate should be **at least \$67 million**.
- 2) sPower has not demonstrated that there is any market for used PV panels.

From the Planning Commission's decommissioning conditions page 6:

"Prior to the issuance of a land-disturbing permit to construct the Facility and in no case later than three (3) months after approval of this Special Use Permit, the Operators shall produce to the County an estimate of the above costs by line item and the surety guaranteeing the payment of those costs and the decommissioning work. The amount of the surety shall be no less than the Property's proportionate share of the Thirty-Six Million Seven Hundred Five Thousand Six Hundred Forty-One Dollars (\$36,705,641.00) already estimated, and excluding recycling credits, as provided by the Applicant's 'Project Decommissioning and Site Restoration Cost Estimate' attached hereto as 'Exhibit G'."

For background, sPower has submitted three decommissioning plans with cost estimates. Each one has been determined by staff to be inadequate and not responsive to the staff and Commissioner's concerns about adequate bonding amount. Ultimately, the Planning Commission approved detailed decommissioning conditions to ensure that the county is adequately protected and to ensure that sPower complies with the County's SEF ordinance 23-4.5.7.

The purpose of the decommissioning bond is to protect the county if/when the site is being abandoned. Decommissioning will occur when it is no longer economic to operate and maintain the facility – for whatever reason. The company that owns it (whether sPower or another entity) is no longer making money and they can't find another buyer for the asset so it must be shutdown. The bond ensures that the decommissioning will be done properly. If the company going out of business does not have a big enough bond to cover the costs, then they are likely to just walk away - the LLC structures allow for streamlined corporate decision making in this instance. The site then becomes the county's problem and expense. In this case, a large site filled with toxic material.

1) Recycling of panels:

During the Planning Commission Public Hearing, the staff noted that they don't see eye-to-eye with sPower on recycling of the solar panels. That's an understatement. The first version of the staff report for SUP 0001 dtd Nov 29th (pg 15 under Key Findings, Against) said that: "The decommissioning bond value cannot be accepted as proposed." The staff report also required "decommissioning plan revisions as recommended by the County's consultant (Dewberry) to address the full breadth of decommissioning a SEF."

sPower <u>has not changed the recommended bond value since then and has not accepted the higher</u> <u>amount</u>. Additionally page 3 of Dewberry's report (dtd 11/26/18) stated "Dewberry recommends that the County require bonding the actual cost of the decommissioning before the recycling amounts are figured in."

sPower's latest decommissioning Conceptual Cost Estimate lists a cost of over \$11 million to remove and recycle the photovoltaic modules. It also includes a credit of over \$8 million as a result of recycling the panels. <u>No reference or evidence was provided to support the \$8 million estimate</u>. Even sPower's consultant, Dr Fthenakis testified on Jan 2nd that First Solar charges to recycle their panels. I've contacted two of the PV panel recyclers that sPower lists in their decommissioning plan and was provided the following costs to recycle the Jinko (crystalline silicon) panels (correspondence from recyclers included as an attachment to this email)*:

Dynamic Lifecycle Innovations: 40 cents/lb Cleanlites Recycling: 48 cents/lb The Jinko CrSi panels weigh 58.4 lbs

Using 100% CrSi panels (as specified by the PC's conditions):

1,800,000 CrSi panels (Dynamic Lifecyle @ 40 cents/lb and 58.4lbs each): <u>\$42,048,000</u>

*while sPower or the county may be able to negotiate bulk or industry discounts with these recyclers, sPower has provided no information to indicate that these price quotes are incorrect.

Based on these estimates, the county would be facing <u>over \$40M to dispose of these panels</u> (in today's dollars) - <u>not</u> an \$8 million credit as sPower's estimate assumes. Since only \$11 million is included in their cost estimate to remove and recycle the panels, there will be an additional cost of approximately \$31 million to dispose of these panels. These estimates will force sPower to adjust their total decommissioning cost from the PC and staff recommended \$36.7 million to over \$65 million. Dr Fthenakis mentioned that he expects the market for panel recycling to change as panels become obsolete and need to be replaced or facilities are decommissioned. If that prediction is correct, then sPower can work with the county to adjust the bond downward every two years as their attorney has suggested. <u>However, there is no market now.</u> If anything the county should over calculate the bond to provide an incentive for the developer to do the decommissioning work themselves rather than walk away and leave it to the county. This protects the county and is in accordance with the SEF ordinance.

Additionally, the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) conducted a study in 2018 to estimate decommissioning costs for a conceptual 11MW solar plant at the end of its useful life. Their key finding was negative net salvage value of \$83/KW which equates to \$41.5 million for sPower's proposed plant. The actual cost for sPower's plant will be higher since the study assumed panels will be landfilled. sPower contends that since they are making such a large investment in this utility solar facility that someone will purchase the used panels intact on the resale market. However, we have found no evidence (and sPower has not provided any) that there is a market for used panels. What developer is going to install 5 or 10 year old

solar panels of unknown condition when newer technology is available? The technology in this industry is constantly changing.

CCSC recommends strongly against modifying the PC approved (and the staff recommended) conditions to provide credit for recycling value and recommends a bond value of approximately \$67 million to cover the full costs (in today's market) to properly dispose of this facility.

Dr Trampe,

At this evening's BOS meeting please consider voting to change the April 9th meeting to a larger venue. That meeting will have the sPower SUPs on the agenda and possible votes on conditions and even final approvals of the SUPs. These proposals have generated intense public interest with hundreds of attendees even after public comment was complete. There was a public notice in today's paper for a BOS/VDOT joint public hearing for April 9th which will add to the crowd size because of interest in the public comment for that topic. I'm sure that hearing can be moved via an updated notice.

The last two BOS meetings (March 12th and 19th) were standing room only and citizens were once again turned away or told to stand in the lobby for the 4-5 hour hearing. The March 12th hearing included the school budget working session and associated public comment as well as extensive discussion and testimony on the sPower SUPs. The March 19th hearing was primarily focused on the sPower SUPs. Many citizens are giving up - either turning around and going home when they see the situation or not coming at all because the county will not accommodate them.

I made a similar request a couple weeks ago (prior to the March 12th meeting) and was informed by the County Administrator that people could stand in the lobby or go to the Marshall Center and watch on a monitor. Dozens of them did stand in the lobby for hours. FYI - that hearing didn't adjourn until after 1am the next morning.

I don't think it serves the public very well to continue with this situation. The County had 3 successive Planning Commission meetings in the Marshall Center to accommodate the crowds. A similar venue change seems to make sense when such large crowds are anticipated.

Mr. Marshall,

I'm following up on your question to Dr Bellas concerning the economic report that he provided to the Board at Tuesday's hearing (actually early yesterday morning). You questioned how much of people's income would be spent in the County as opposed to going to nearby counties (i.e. the Walmart in Orange County). The hour was late and I understand the Board needed to move on to the other Public Hearing so I wanted to reemphasize Dr Bellas' point. He is using the same government estimates for the distribution of spending that sPower (Mangum) is using. SPower can't know how many of their jobs and associated spending will be done in the county either. Many of the 20 employees that they state in the Mangum report (34 FTEs with the ripple effect) could reside in Orange or Culpeper county and/or spend much of their \$\$ there. Dr Bellas is simply comparing apples to apples when considering the potential economic impact of other uses that the landowners might have for that property over the next 40 years.

Dr. Bellas' key message is that the county should carefully consider the economic impacts before locking the county into a declining tax revenue for 40+ years for an industrial use such as this utility solar facility. Additionally, 40 years is only the estimate in the Mangum report - the SUPs are written such that there is no sunset date on this project.

Dr Bellas is not saying that the landowners should not be allowed to sell their property. They can sell their property at any time to anyone. However, it's the Board's decision whether or not to approve sPower's SUPs to build the first ever solar energy facility in the county on this

property (6,350 acres total) with such a negative/decreasing fiscal and economic benefit to the county when compared with other land uses.

When you visited us out here and over at Michael O'Bier's you indicated that you didn't see how sPower can be required to provide any monetary incentives for the project. As was confirmed at the hearing on Tuesday, any promises on their part are unenforceable. So all you're left with is tax revenue and economic development benefits and they don't amount to much.

FYI - Dr Bellas is a noted economist in our region who has, in fact, worked with Mr. Payne on other development projects. He has a sterling reputation and is available to discuss this further.

Dr. Bellas' analogy is that if the graph plot of sPower's tax revenue was your retirement account, you really would not be happy. In my opinion this proposal will be a very bad deal for the county both fiscally and economically.

Wanda,

In looking at the last email from Ben Saunders about PV module recycling, it's not clear to me what they're saying now. The 15 Nov Conceptual Cost Estimate doesn't talk about landfilling panels – only recycling. It doesn't say they plan to salvage them either (definition: reuse them in the current configuration). It appears that you're trying to get them to provide the basis for the \$8,175,756 credit number but their first answer (Saunders' March 13 email) says they would "landfill the rest of the PV module (glass and substrate)" which wasn't even mentioned in the cost estimate. Being honest, I think they're trying to back into that number by claiming landfilling at the last minute (which is prohibited in the conditions anyway). The other disconnect is in the most recent email (Saunders March 14) where he states that he received more information about the recycling value estimates and lists the recycled glass value of \$0.07/lb. The previous email said they were going to landfill the module including the glass. They can't get any value of recycled glass without sending it to a recycling facility – you don't just remove the glass from the substrate in the field – they're bonded together.

Until they provide you a complete breakdown of the weights, costs etc, their numbers still don't add up. And of course I don't think the county wants to allow them to landfill 1.8M panels as I noted in my earlier email to the BOS.

After extensive research over the last year and a report from the county's consultant (Dewberry), the staff recommended that the Planning Commission provide no credit for recycling values. The Planning Commission agreed and included that provision several times in their approved conditions. From the staff report for SUP18-0001, Page 18: <u>"Since recycling values and costs in the future is unknown, no credit is permitted in the current conditions."</u>

Summary (details below):

- 1) Recycling of panels cost \$\$. The minimum value of \$36.7 million that the Planning Commission and staff have established should be significantly higher because there is a cost to recycle solar panels. The decommissioning cost estimate should be **at least \$67 million**.
- 2) sPower has not demonstrated that there is any market for used PV panels.

From the Planning Commission's decommissioning conditions page 6:

"Prior to the issuance of a land-disturbing permit to construct the Facility and in no case later than three (3) months after approval of this Special Use Permit, the Operators shall produce to the County an estimate of the above costs by line item and the surety guaranteeing the payment of those costs and the decommissioning work. The amount of the surety shall be no less than the Property's proportionate share of the Thirty-Six Million Seven Hundred Five Thousand Six Hundred Forty-One Dollars (\$36,705,641.00) already estimated, and excluding recycling credits, as provided by the Applicant's 'Project Decommissioning and Site Restoration Cost Estimate' attached hereto as 'Exhibit G'."

For background, sPower has submitted three decommissioning plans with cost estimates. Each one has been determined by staff to be inadequate and not responsive to the staff and Commissioner's concerns about adequate bonding amount. Ultimately, the Planning Commission approved detailed decommissioning conditions to ensure that the county is adequately protected and to ensure that sPower complies with the County's SEF ordinance 23-4.5.7.

The purpose of the decommissioning bond is to protect the county if/when the site is being abandoned. Decommissioning will occur when it is no longer economic to operate and maintain the facility – for whatever reason. The company that owns it (whether sPower or another entity) is no longer making money and they can't find another buyer for the asset so it must be shutdown. The bond ensures that the decommissioning will be done properly. If the company going out of business does not have a big enough bond to cover the costs, then they are likely to just walk away - the LLC structures allow for streamlined corporate decision making in this instance. The site then becomes the county's problem and expense. In this case, a large site filled with toxic material.

1) Recycling of panels:

During the Planning Commission Public Hearing, the staff noted that they don't see eye-to-eye with sPower on recycling of the solar panels. That's an understatement. The first version of the staff report for SUP 0001 dtd Nov 29th (pg 15 under Key Findings, Against) said that: "The decommissioning bond value cannot be accepted as proposed." The staff report also required "decommissioning plan revisions as recommended by the County's consultant (Dewberry) to address the full breadth of decommissioning a SEF." sPower has not changed the recommended bond value since then and has not accepted the higher amount. Additionally page 3 of Dewberry's report (dtd 11/26/18) stated "Dewberry recommends that the County require bonding the actual cost of the decommissioning before the recycling amounts are figured in."

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Dynamic Lifecycle Innovations: 40 cents/lb Cleanlites Recycling: 48 cents/lb The Jinko CrSi panels weigh 58.4 lbs

Using 100% CrSi panels (as specified by the PC's conditions):

1,800,000 CrSi panels (Dynamic Lifecyle @ 40 cents/lb and 58.4lbs each): <u>\$42,048,000</u>

*while sPower or the county may be able to negotiate bulk or industry discounts with these recyclers, sPower has provided no information to indicate that these price quotes are incorrect.

Based on these estimates, the county would be facing <u>over \$40M to dispose of these panels</u> (in today's dollars) - <u>not</u> an \$8 million credit as sPower's estimate assumes. Since only \$11 million is included in their cost estimate to remove and recycle the panels, there will be an additional cost of approximately \$31 million to dispose of these panels. These estimates will force sPower to adjust their total decommissioning cost from the PC and staff recommended \$36.7 million to over \$65 million. Dr Fthenakis mentioned that he expects the market for panel recycling to change as panels become obsolete and need to be replaced or facilities are decommissioned. If that prediction is correct, then sPower can work with the county to adjust the bond downward every two years as their attorney has suggested. <u>However, there is no market now.</u> If anything the county should over calculate the bond to provide an incentive for the developer to do the decommissioning work themselves rather than walk away and leave it to the county. This protects the county and is in accordance with the SEF ordinance.

Additionally, the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI) conducted a study in 2018 to estimate decommissioning costs for a conceptual 11MW solar plant at the end of its useful life. Their key finding was negative net salvage value of \$83/KW which equates to \$41.5 million for sPower's proposed plant. The actual cost for sPower's plant will be higher since the study assumed panels will be landfilled. sPower contends that since they are making such a large investment in this utility solar facility that someone will purchase the used panels intact on the resale market. However, we have found no evidence (and sPower has not provided any) that there is a market for used panels. What developer is going to install 5 or 10 year old solar panels of unknown condition when newer technology is available? The technology in this industry is constantly changing.

CCSC recommends strongly against modifying the PC approved (and the staff recommended) conditions to provide credit for recycling value and recommends a bond value of approximately \$67 million to cover the full costs (in today's market) to properly dispose of this facility.

When it comes to determining the real economic impact of a large utility scale solar facility in Virginia, the most credible sources are the county officials who have implemented and are living with these large facilities. The only expert testimony you have received on this topic has been from sPower's paid consultant, Dr Mangum. Therefore, I strongly encourage the Supervisors to reach out to Accomack and Southampton counties (as we have done) to learn more about the complete lack of follow-on economic development and the only small uptick in jobs as a result of the construction and operation of these facilities. They also have important lessons learned from their experiences that resulted in significant changes to their ordinances and Comp Plans to restrict future utility solar development in their counties. Accomack and Southampton have the largest utility solar facilities in operation in the state. With all due respect to Dr Mangum and his economic model, he offers no real world data on the economic impact either during construction or after completion of these projects. He offers you a computer model with data inputs provided by sPower.

These are the counties with real world experience in Virginia with large utility scale solar facilities. Talk to the folks who have implemented this in Virginia - in our tax regime, our climate and our regulatory environment:

- Southampton County, VA (Amazon Solar Farm Virginia Southampton) 100MW, 1,200 acres.

I recommend that these county officials be asked to come here to testify in front of you or via phone during the hearing. That way you can hear it unfiltered for yourselves.

Here are the questions that we asked them - just within the last month.

- Have you seen any new economic development as a result of the solar facility?
- Does your county benefit from any of the power or is it sold to corporate customers?
- How much local benefit in jobs and economic activity did you experience during construction?
- How many people are currently employed at the facility and type of job?
- Have the tax revenues been as expected after assessment by the SCC (applies to Southampton only)?
- Did the implementation of this large utility solar facility result in the County changing their ordinances and/or Comp Plan as it relates to future solar facilities?

Supervisors,

To the extent that your decision on these SUPs is dependent on Mr. Creamer's Dec 3rd letter, I respectfully suggest that your confidence is misplaced – these promises cannot be enforced. This letter promises \$25 million over the 40 year life of the project. I challenge the Supervisors or staff to provide similar examples where a developer made a similar UNENFORCEABLE promise of funding at this level and followed through on it (not a proffer or other enforceable requirement). This is unprecedented. Has this ever happened in Spotsylvania County or nearby localities?

Since this massive utility project doesn't stand on its own merits, Mr. Creamer has decided to attempt to buy SUP approval with an unenforceable promissory note. He is merely shifting the Board's attention from the huge risks, including financial risks, by offering very tenuous UNENFORCEABLE promises to those who will listen.

Is the Board willing to provide the auditable, accountable and enforceable documentation to the public that specifies exactly how, by who, and when each and every element of the sPower CEO's promises will be delivered – over the life of this project?

I recommend you consider this information as sPower continues to canvas Supervisors to determine what it will take to secure your vote.

Do you trust them? We don't because of their duplicity on whether or not they are purchasing land from NTS, because of their quiet attempt to uprate their PJM connection which was only withdrawn after citizens discovered it and because of their acceptance of certain conditions after the Planning Commission vote (no burning and no CdTe panels) before switching to opposing those conditions. There are additional areas of great concern involving sPower's corporate risk, accountability and liability that we recommend you review – attached. This short document was compiled at the request of several Supervisors.

Finally these are some of the many questions that should be answered before proceeding to accept promises from Mr. Creamer:

- Does the attached information and points noted above make you comfortable with accepting this arrangement?
- What is the arrangement? In what form? Verbal? Written?
- What are you not telling the public about other promises from sPower?
- What would happen if (all very reasonable scenarios):
 - Mr. Creamer is unable to continue to serve as CEO for whatever reason and steps down? The letter gets thrown in his trashcan as he walks out the door.
 - sPower comes under financial pressure because of their exposure to the PG&E contracts and is forced to tighten their belts for a few years resulting in a freeze in payments. What if they can't start them back up again? This essentially puts the county in the solar business and subject to the ups and downs of that industry.
 - What happens when sPower sells the project to Dominion or another utility or investment group? New owners will not honor a letter signed by a long gone CEO.
 - What if AES, AIMCo and Ullico (owners of sPower) decide that they're not receiving the desired return on their investment from sPower and let Mr. Creamer go in favor of a new cost cutting CEO who won't recognize an UNENFORCEABLE letter from his predecessor?
- In reference to these promises, Mr. Payne stated at the March 12 public hearing that the items in the Creamer letter of Dec 3rd were suggestions and it would be "up to the county to make that determination" as to allocation of those funds.
- How will those funds (if they appear) be allocated and when since they will be provided "over the life of the project."?
- Which districts will benefit the most?
- Will the Supervisors be making these decisions in private or in public?
- Will the allocation of these phantom funds be subject to change after the next BOS elections?

SPower accountability, risk and liability

There are many unknowns about sPower but there some things that we do know:

- Spower doesn't submit financial reports since their earnings are rolled up into the parent companies (AES, AIMCo and Ullico)
- Other than a phonecall to one of their customers, we're not aware of any due diligence that the county staff or Supervisors have done on this company. More detail can be found at: <u>https://drive.google.com/file/d/1f5Yc-naDpxLOPhkqbUGlqL3-LuToHrE1/view</u>
- In November 2018, AES and AIMCo each sold 12% stakes in sPower to insurance and investment company, Ullico. Current ownership structure: AES and AIMCo – 38% each; Ullico – 24%. sPower's briefing material to the Board of Supervisors fails to mention this acquisition and its implications and does not list Ullico as a part owner.
- According to RiverheadLOCAL, sPower attempted to deceive the Riverhead, NY planning board in 2018 involving an environmental approval for a solar facility. Excerpts from Riverheadlocal.com, Oct 4, 2018:
 - "The SEQRA process asked sPower to identify any other projects that may have an impact on the sPower one project," Carey said. 'On several occasions the planning board directly asked sPower representatives about the gen-tie lines and the need for many empty conduits,' an angry Carey said, referring to the underground generation tie line that is proposed to cross Edwards Avenue from west to east, connecting the solar generation facility to an existing LIPA substation on the east side of Edwards Avenue."
 - "In my opinion, this is a lack of information-sharing by sPower and possible willful misrepresentation with intent to deceive," the planning board chairman said. "But at the very least they were certainly not forthcoming."
 - "Carey said the planning board would also deliver to the building department a memorandum recommending that the sPower Riverhead Solar-1 building permit be 'suspended while the supplemental EIS is completed.'"

Excerpts from an editorial board piece in the Pensacola News Journal, August 4, 2018:

- "Incoa hired a local attorney to pressure Mayor Ashton Hayward into adding the lease approval to next week's city council meeting agenda."
- "It is absurd and insulting to citizens of Pensacola that little known Utah-based company, Incoa Performance Minerals, has tried to pressure city officials into negotiating and approving a 10-year lease at the Port of Pensacola in just a few weeks."
- "It is also crucial that city residents know more about the individuals who are looking to utilize such an important public asset. And Incoa's CEO, Steve Creamer, has a controversial business history that is fair to evaluate in terms of any potential deal."
- "Little also found a 2004 Associated Press article that summed up some of Creamer's other past problems.
- 'The bad parts include a failed highway through the Book Cliffs, engineering problems that contributed to the failure of a dam near St. George, a proposal to bring spent nuclear fuel to Southern Utah and an experimental paving material called Syncrete that cracked and crumbled before an expensive road project was even completed, costing the state millions...'
- Later, Creamer served as CEO of a company called EnergySolutions, which became the largest nuclear waste company in the United States, then called Envirocare. Reporting on the company describes Creamer as an environmentally controversial figure deeply entrenched in the world of Utah politics."

PG&E bankruptcy: While nobody knows with absolute certainty how the protracted legal battles will play out over the next two to four years, what's at stake is about \$42 billion in legacy Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs) that PG&E has entered into, mostly for above-market renewable energy supplies from providers that include sPower. According to their website, sPower has no fewer than 40 Utility Energy (742 MW) and 26 Distributed Energy Projects in California as of today. From sPower's website:

<u>May 18, 2016</u>, California and Salt Lake City. **PG&E awards sPower 60MW of solar Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs)** in CA. Utah-based sPower has been awarded 20-year PPA contracts by PG&E for 60 MW of solar capacity in CA. The contracts are for three projects, named Bayshore A, B and C, which are all situated in Lancaster, southern California. "We are excited to expand our relationship with PG&E to a total of more than 100MW of solar, helping them achieve their goals to deliver safe, reliable, clean energy to their customers," said Ryan Creamer, sPower CEO, in a statement. "We admire PG&E's leadership in clean power transformation and are pleased to be part of the process."

The risks and liability associated with sPower's direct and indirect contracts with PG&E, as well as its intertwined regulatory, political and contractual agreements with multiple other partners in CA must be fully, not selectively, disclosed. Failure to do so will potentially result in negative economic and fiscal impacts upon county residents. EDITORIAL: Solar project is too big for Spotsylvania

AFTER meeting with both sides and reviewing reams of docu- ments, we've determined that the rancorous year-long debate over a proposed 6,350-acre solar power plant that has pitted Concerned Citizens of Spotsylvania County, a small local grassroots group, against a large, out-of-state corporation comes down to this: the project is way too big for western Spotsylvania County, and there are too few benefits to county residents to offset this major deficiency.

Utah-based Sustainable Power Group (sPower) wants to turn 10 square miles of agriculturally-zoned land that was previously a tree farm into a forest of solar panels, making it the largest solar facility on the East Coast. The company's plan to shield this utility-sized power plant from view with trees and berms doesn't change the fact that it is massive in scale.

Too massive, in fact, for an agricultural zone that abuts a residential area. Which is why the county's Planning Commission recommended that sPower be given a special use permit to erect solar panels only on 245 acres, the smallest of its three connecting sites and also the one farthest away from homes.

Some objections to the 500-megawatt, \$615 million project, including nearby residents' fears that the proposed solar facility would cause major environmental and health problems during construction and its subsequent 30 years of operation, seem somewhat overblown, and more attributable to a Not In My Backyard attitude that is making it harder and harder to erect needed infrastructure pretty much anywhere.

Both sides have hired appraisers who disagree on what impact the solar farm would have on nearby home values, but it seems beyond dispute that solar panels would be quiet, undemanding neighbors. sPower has also committed to spending \$25 million in community upgrades, including replacing aging water pipes in Fawn Lake, although the company admits that these enticements are not legally enforceable.

But sPower's resistance to posting a cash bond or irrevocable letter of credit to protect Spotsylvania taxpayers from what could be an enormous cost of decommissioning and disposing of 1.8 million solar panels containing toxic cadmium telluride at the end of their useful lifespans if the project's multiple

limited liability corporations skip out is troubling. So is its insistence that the supposed future recycling value of the spent panels three decades from now be included in its current decommissioning plan.

Related to the project's massive scale—in an area that is much closer to a residential area than most of the nation's solar facilities of its size—is the fact that sPower has already contracted to sell all of the electricity generated by the proposed Spotsylvania solar facility to power-guzzling tech giants Apple and Microsoft, as well as the University of Richmond.

Microsoft, which already has a data center in Loudoun County, is utilizing tax breaks and a \$1.5 million state grant to expand in Mecklenburg County. The expansion will add 100 more jobs, but they'll all be in Southside, not Spotsylvania.

sPower points to millions of dollars of increased tax revenues the land would generate as a solar plant instead of a tree farm, with no corresponding pressure on county services that a residential subdivision in that same location would create. But a tree farm and a suburban subdivision are not the only options there.

Dr. Dean Bellas of Alexandria-based Urban Analytics, who was hired by Concerned Citizens to analyze the economic impact of the proposed solar farm, noted that "under the sPower proposal, Spotsylvania County will receive declining tax revenues annually on a per-acre basis on an appreciating asset (real estate)."

Bellas concluded that "the forgone tax revenues to Spotsylvania County from alternative development scenarios are substantial... The County would also enjoy larger economic benefits (new jobs, new labor income, and the multiplier effect on the local economy) with less acreage needed."

Bottom line: If Microsoft or Apple were building a new data center in Spotsylvania County and creating high-paying jobs there, a good case could be made for building such a large solar facility alongside to power it. But that's not the case. All of the electricity produced, and most of the jobs the project will support after a brief construction period, will be elsewhere.

Even under a best-case scenario with no adverse impacts on local residents, Spotsylvania County will forgo the possibility of more lucrative economic development in the area for a 30-year deal that will mostly benefit sPower and two of the largest corporations in the world. Property taxes and a \$25 million good-faith gesture are not enough to offset the potential loss of new jobs, future economic development and the increased tax revenue it would bring, and the loss of thousands of acres of agricultural land.

Solar power can and should be part of Virginia's energy mix, but this project is too big and offers too few benefits to the county. The Board of Supervisors should follow the Planning Commission's recommendation and grant sPower a special use permit only on the smallest of the three parcels.

The clearing of the property was and is part of a department of forestry (DOF) activity and is being performed for the current property owner(s). It falls under an exemption from our local review or inspections because they are regulated by DOF directly.

All state agencies must abide by the Chesapeake Bay act and must have erosion control measures in place before and during the activity.

The County has no control or regulatory authority to enforce a forestry practice unless the DOF agents contact us for a violation and for this project there was no violations called in at all.

I am sorry that this does not adequately answer your concerns but you are expressing the same concerns that have been presented to DEQ and other state officials over the years that we need help with. I have personally seen little change in DOF practices my 40+ years of this type of work.

Mr. Street:

The following photographs were taken last weekend from our airplane flying over the 6,000 acre site being considered for the solar power plant. I am not being melodramatic when I say that from the air, "it looks like the bomb hit!"

Having worked with you, several times, over the years to make sure everything done on our property was in accordance with the (very

strict) rules of the Chesapeake Bay Conservation Authority regarding RPA, I do not understand how what has been done to this land could possibly have complied with those same rules.

The barren areas you see have, in some cases, been barren for many months. People down in the areas near W. Catharpin and Post Oak have had literal streams running across their properties during rainy times in the last few months. One woman took a picture of her grandson canoeing across her yard in the deep run off!! There are four streams on this property that eventually flow into the Po River, and ultimately reach the Chesapeake Bay!! What we see in these pictures only shows part of the area and, also, does not show anywhere near the complete clearing and land disturbance that will be done for the installation of the solar panels if this project is approved!

You don't have to take my word for this, we are more than willing to take you up in our single engine, 4 passenger Mooney Aircraft (at Shannon Airport) to view this for yourself, anytime you are available. Just let us know. My husband is a retired commercial pilot, so you can feel comfortable flying with him.

When I saw this, I honestly felt as though the rules that apply to the citizens of the county, do not apply to major landowners and corporations. The devastation to the land and subsequent potential for damage to the Chesapeake is thousands of times greater (based on the acreage) than anything a homeowner could possibly do. As homeowners, we are threatened with fines, etc. if we don't comply with the environmental rules. Why have the owners of these properties not been, and why has this land been allowed to be devastated and remain barren for so very long??

I heard you talk at the Planning Commission meeting about how your office will be monitoring sPower, for compliance, if this is approved.

Seeing what has happened so far, apparently without your knowledge or intervention, I'm not confident that will be done satisfactorily.

Thank you for your thorough and informative response. You obviously cared enough to put in a significant amount of time to make sure I understand the "system", if you will. Your detailed explanation raises new questions. You stated:

"Should the solar project be approved, the timber harvest would be designated as development and Spotsylvania County would assume responsibility. Also, if anyone begins to clear the land by digging up stumps or doing any site work beyond that which is justified for forestry then the VDOF will determine that the silviculture exemption no longer applies and alert the locality."

With all due respect, I must say that it's pretty clear your department is not making inspections frequently enough!! *There is stumping being done* (and has been for some time) *and serious run off problems as well as RPA encroachment and erosion runoff violations*. There has also been clearing done inside the RPA! There are logging roads that run through streams (with fresh vehicle tracks) on the property. We have photographs of all of this to back up what we say. A few representative examples are included herein.

I have just been made aware that two other members of our organization (Concerned Citizens of Spotsylvania) have been communicating with the local and state authorities. Mike Anastasio has been in communication with Ed Zimmer in your Department. Richard Genaille has toured the area with some of the Spotsylvania County Supervisors and has seen the destruction first hand. In the interest of simplifying the communication on this for efficiency's sake, Mike Anastasio and I will bow out and let Richard Genaille be the point of contact going forward. I have copied both of them on this email.

Mr. Genaille has numerous photographs and videos of violations (based on the info and requirements specified in your last email). - 2. I have been requested by Holding Redlich on behalf of the City of Greater Shepparton to provide my opinion in relation to certain aspects of the proposed Solar Farms at Tatura East, Tallygaroopna, Lemnos and Congupna

My Qualifications and Experience

- 3. I am the Chair of the International Energy Agency's Solar Heating and Cooling Program and until the end of 2017 also Chairman of the ISO Standards Committee on Solar Energy.
- 4. Until August 2012 I was the General Manager, Sustainable Environs at Sustainability Victoria, Australia, where I oversaw programs to increase the deployment of sustainable energy technologies.
- 5. I have Engineering qualifications from Melbourne University, and postgraduate business qualifications.

My area of expertise to make the report

- 6. I have worked in the area of renewable energy since 1978.
- 7. In August 2017, I provided a report to the City of Greater Shepparton regarding the Tatura East solar farm that reviews some of the objections made to that planning application.
- 8. In January 2018 I provided a presentation to the Council of the City of Greater Shepparton on the potential impact of solar farms on local temperatures and also provided some background on the electricity grid in relation to the four solar farm proposals that were before council at that time.

- 9. The planning applications have been made to the City of Greater Shepparton by the proponents listed below:
 - For the proposed 45 MW solar farm at Tatura East by Clean Gen on 5 June 2017;

 - For the proposed 68 MW solar farm at Congupna by X-Elio on 3 November 2017:

Question 1: Describe the relevant particulars of the applications


20. The applications are for Solar Photovoltaic Farms. The number of Solar Photovoltaic Panels and capacity of alternating current (AC) electrical power produced when operating at peak solar input is shown in the table below, with other information provided in the relevant Panel Books.

- 21. All applications include a buffer along the boundary of the solar arrays and include vegetation within that buffer. This is to provide a visual screen as stated in some applications. The application for the Lemnos solar farm does not include vegetation on all sides of the solar farm. It is not common practice to have vegetation screening along the boundary of solar farms in Australia and overseas.
- 22. Solar PV panels are flat, thin, light weight and robust devices that convert light into electricity by using semiconductor materials. The panels will be placed in arrays on single axis trackers that rotate from facing Easterly in the morning through horizontal at midday to facing Westerly in the afternoon. Note that Neoen have stated that they may have some or all panels fixed. However, current practice in large solar farms in Australia is to have all panels mounted on single axis trackers.
- 23. From calculations using the TRNSYS modelling package, panels placed on a tracker of this type in the Shepparton area will allow the panels to intercept approximately 23%



more solar radiation than a fixed panel placed facing True North inclined at an angle equal to the latitude (approximately 36.5°).




24. The solar irradiance intercepted by the tracking panels will be higher in Summer and lower in winter than a fixed installation. As shown in the figure below:

25. Apart from the increased solar radiation available to the panels, tracking will also allow the panels to intercept more solar radiation earlier in the morning and later into the afternoon, providing a less variable output. The following Figure illustrates that comparison for an average day.



Question 2: Describe the electricity grid

- 26. The electricity grid is made up of transmission and distribution lines that carry electricity from large generators to the end users that consume electricity. The transmission network operates at extra high voltage 220 500 kV. The distribution system takes electricity from the transmission system and delivers it at an appropriate voltage level for users.
- 27. Local generation can be fed into the distribution system where there is capacity to absorb the amount of power produced.
- 28. For generators of the capacity proposed in these four sites the electricity produced must be fed into the transmission system at or above 66KV.
- 29. The distribution system in and around Shepparton is owned and operated by Powercor. Powercor distributes electricity to the western side of Victoria which includes much of the state's good solar resource, being the north and west of Victoria.
- 30. Powercor provides the generation capacity available on their 66kV Sub-Transmission lines on their website at https://www.powercor.com.au/our-services/electricity-connections/solar-and-other-generation/connecting-larger-embedded-generator-systems/. The following figure is copied from that website. The colours indicate available generation capacity on that 66kV line. Green indicates that between 50 135 MW can be fed into that line. Red indicates less than 10 MW capacity is available. It can be seen that many of the 66kv lines around Shepparton, but not many lines in other parts of the state, have capacity.



- 31. The following figure shows more detail from the Powecor website of the area around Shepparton. The website shows that the following capacity is available on those 66kV sub-transmission lines.
 - Shepparton Terminal Station to Numurkah 1 (SHTS NKA 1) has indicative generation capacity of 92 MW,
 - Shepparton Terminal Station to Numurkah 2 (SHTS NKA 2) has indicative generation capacity of 86MW,
 - Numurkah to Cobram East (NKA-CME) has indicative generation capacity of 63 MW,
 - Shepparton Terminal Station to Kyabram 1 (SHTS-KYM1) has indicative generation capacity of 76MW,
 - Shepparton Terminal Station to Stanhope (SHTS-SHP) has indicative generation capacity of 96MW.



32. The proposals are that

- Clean Gen plan for the Tatura East site to connect into the Stanhope Shepparton 66kV line (SHTS-SHP) which has capacity to accept this amount of power.
- X-Elio sites at Tallygaroopna (30MW) and Congupna (68MW) plan to connect in to the Numurkah Shepparton 66kV line (SHTS-NKA No 1) which has 'indicative' capacity to accept 92 MW.

- Neoen propose to pay to build a line to the Shepparton Terminal station to connect the 100MW solar farm at Lemnos.
- 33. A solar farm builder is responsible to pay for a power line and switching station to take the electricity from their installation to a part of the grid that has capacity available to accept the amount of electricity they will generate. From the Powercor website it can be seen that the cost of the switching station is \$5.0 million each and that a 66kV line will cost \$300,000 per km installed overhead or \$1.2 Million per kilometre installed underground. The lines and switching station are installed and owned by Powercor who will be responsible for the operation and maintenance.

Question 3: Describe the renewable energy policy context for solar farms in Victoria

- 34. The Victorian government has strong policy supporting renewable electricity deployment in Victoria.
- 35. The Climate Change Act 2017 establishes a target for Victoria to have net zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 The preamble to the Act states "The Parliament of Victoria recognises that the community wants and expects Victoria to play its part in global mitigation efforts and in preparing the community for unavoidable climatic impacts"
- 36. The Victorian Renewable Energy Action Plan states "Victoria's Climate Change Framework makes it clear that moving to a clean energy supply by increasing renewable energy generation is a key pillar of the state's approach to emissions reduction". It also aims to "create jobs, attract investment and grow our economy through boosting the new energy technologies sector." And states " In the northwest of our state, solar PV is beginning to be rolled out at utility-scale. Planned grid augmentation will help unlock our abundant natural resources well into the future."
- 37. The Victorian Government is also purchasing electricity from a solar PV farm at Wunghnu to offset the electricity consumed by the Melbourne tram system.

The Victorian Renewable Energy Target.

- 38. The Victorian Renewable Energy Target is complementary to, and operates in a similar manner to, the Commonwealth's Renewable Energy Target. However, it will cover only limited technologies to supply electricity into the Victorian electricity grid, initially wind and solar.
- 39. The Victorian Renewable Energy Target is defined in the Renewable Energy (Jobs and Investment) Act 2017.

The Act defines "**renewable energy** source means any of the following energy sources—

- (a) solar;
- (b) wind;
- (c) an energy source declared by the Minister ..."

It also sets targets "The renewable energy targets are-

(a) by 2020, for 25% of electricity generated in Victoria to be generated by means of facilities that generate electricity by utilising renewable energy sources or converting renewable energy sources into electricity;

and

(b) by 2025, for 40% of electricity generated in Victoria to be generated by means of facilities that generate electricity by utilising renewable energy sources or converting renewable energy sources into electricity"

Question 4; Describe the suitability or otherwise of the Shepparton region from the perspective of the development of solar farms

Solar availability

- 40. Availability of solar energy is one important criteria for a financially viable solar site. The solar resource available is measured in terms of average Global Horizontal Irradiance (GHI) and Direct Normal Irradiance (DNI).
- 41. GHI is the solar power falling on a horizontal surface. It is often given in MJ/m²/day averaged over a year. It illustrates the total amount of energy likely to be available, however a tilted surface facing toward the equator will intercept more irradiation as it will face more directly toward the sun.
- 42. DNI is a measure of the energy coming directly from the sun to the collecting surface that is tracking in two dimensions so that it is always facing directly toward the sun. Clear sky conditions provide higher DNI. A high level of DNI is necessary to obtain the increased performance for tracking collectors required to offset the additional costs and complexity.
- 43. Solar energy available at Shepparton is relatively high on an international basis. From the Australian Renewable Energy Mapping Infrastructure (AREMI) data found at http://nationalmap.gov.au/renewables/ the solar radiation at Shepparton is average GHI 17.6 MJ/m²/day and average DNI 20.7 MJ/m²/day. For comparison Shepparton figures are similar to Wangaratta and Albury and:
 - 7% less GHI and 8% less DNI than Mildura;
 - 3% less GHI and DNI Kerang;
 - 14% more GHI and 26% more DNI than Melbourne;
 - 2% more GHI and 6% more DNI than Bendigo; and
 - 30% less GHI and 27% less DNI than Alice Springs.
- 44. On the criteria of availability of solar energy, the Shepparton region has a good solar resource, similar to other sunny regions of Victoria, Northwest of the Great Dividing Range.

Proximity to a grid connection point

- 45. Apart from the level of solar energy available, the proximity to a suitable connection point with available capacity is often the most critical element when selecting a viable solar site. To the proponent of a solar farm, proximity to the electricity grid is a key criterion as construction of distribution and/or transmission lines can significantly add to project cost. See earlier section on Question 2
- 46. As outlined in that section (Question 2) of this report, the Shepparton region has good access to connections in to powerlines with available capacity, better than much of the rest of the state with good solar resource.
- 47. Therefore, on these two critical elements of financial viability, the Shepparton area is highly suitable for deployment of strategically placed solar farms and is a more suitable location than most other areas of Victoria.

Question 5 What is your view in relation to whether there is a heat island effect?

What is a "Heat Island"?

- 48. The heat island effect is the term that is generally used to describe increased temperatures in urban areas compared to surrounding rural areas. The American Meteorological Society Glossary of Meteorology defines the term Urban Heat Island (Or heat island.) as "Closed isotherms indicating an area of the surface that is relatively warm; most commonly associated with areas of human disturbance such as towns and cities. The physiographic analogy derives from the similarity between the pattern of isotherms and height contours of an island on a topographic map. Heat islands commonly also possess "cliffs" at the urban-rural fringe and a "peak" in the most built-up core of the city. The annual mean temperature of a large city (say 1 million inhabitants) may be 1°–2°C warmer than before development, and on individual calm, clear nights may be up to 12°C warmer. The warmth extends vertically to form an urban heat dome in near calm, and an urban heat plume in more windy conditions". This question relates to whether there is a similar effect for PV farms, the photovoltaic heat island (PVHI) effect.
- 49. Barron-Gafford et al (2016)³ simultaneously monitored temperatures 2.5 m above the soil at three sites in Arizona. The sites represented a natural desert ecosystem, the traditional built environment (parking lot surrounded by commercial buildings), and a PV power plant. They found that "*temperatures over a PV plant were regularly 3–4* °C *warmer than wildlands at night*". This effect was greater in warmer months than in cooler seasons. They claimed this to "...*demonstrate that the PVHI effect is real and can significantly increase temperatures over PV power plant installations relative to nearby wildland*". They also postulated that the PVHI "*may be due to heat trapping of re-radiated sensible heat flux under PV arrays at night*".
- 50. Fthenakis and Yu (2013)⁴ measured temperatures at a height of 2.5 m at a solar farm in Canada within the PV field and at a number of points for a distance of up to 800m from the outside of the PV array. They found that "both the field data and the simulations show that the annual average of air temperatures in the center of PV field can reach up to 1.9°C above the ambient temperature, and that this thermal energy completely dissipates to the environment at heights of 5 to 18 m." ...and... "analysis of 18 months of detailed data showed that in most days, the solar array was completely cooled at night, and, thus, it is unlikely that a heat island effect could occur."
- 51. These two papers indicate that temperatures within the solar farm will be higher than in the surrounding areas for at least part of the time. Whether that constitutes a "Heat Island" depends on whether the definition used requires it to be at an elevated temperature all the time or on average. However, Fthenakis and Yu also indicate that the PV farms also exhibits another of the characteristics of a heat island, which is the temperature "cliffs" at the fringe of the PV farm where temperatures drop quickly into the surrounding area.

Will there be an increased temperature in the solar farm?

- 52. Liwei Yang et al (2017)⁵ measured temperatures within and outside a PV farm in Golmud, China in the Gobi Desert. "The results show that the air temperature at a height of 2 m at the two sites is essentially the same during winter daytime, but in the other seasons, the daytime air temperature at the PV farm is higher than that in the region without PV. The maximum difference appears during the summer daytime, with a value of 0.7°C (the summer daytime averaged value). The night time air temperature at a height of 2m during the four seasons at the solar farm was higher than that in the region without PV arrays, since the solar panels have a heat preservation effect near the ground. The differences in values between the two sites were 0.1, 0.3, 0.2, and 0.1°C in summer, autumn, winter and spring, respectively." and "The results show that the daily range of soil temperature at a depth of 5–10 cm at the solar farm is lower than that in the region without PV farm."
- 53. The sites studied by Liwei Yang et al, and Barron-Gafford et al have similar solar radiation levels both higher than in Shepparton. The IRENA Global Atlas for Renewable Energy shows GHI of 20.3 MJ/m²/day in Golmud and 20.9 MJ/m²/day in Arizona. The GHI at the site studied by Fthenakis and Yu is 13.1 MJ/m²/day.
- 54. It is surprising to see the range of temperatures between the studies of Liwei Yang et al, and Barron-Gafford et al as they have very similar solar climates. This may be due to other differences such as ground cover.
- 55. Two of these studies were conducted on solar farms that had fixed PV panels rather than tracking panels as planned in the four solar farms proposed for the Shepparton Municipality. Tracking panels are generally spread wider apart than stationary panels. Wider spacing and, if parked overnight nearer to vertical, will allow more radiant heat loss to the sky, so in my opinion the temperatures in a tracking PV field can, if managed appropriately, be lower compared to those in a stationary PV field.
- 56. Based on these three papers it is my view that there will be an elevated temperature <u>within</u> the PV farm compared to the same site in current use and that the increased temperature will be of the range:
 - In winter, night time air temperatures above the panels will be 0.2 3.0 °C above temperatures outside the PV farm,
 - In summer, temperatures will be 0.1 4 °C higher above the panels than outside the PV field and:
 - In the soil under the PV panels, temperatures are cooler during the day and warmer at night, than outside the PV field.
- 57. It should be noted that temperature changes of this order are often encountered with changes in land use. For example, de Vries and Birch (1961)⁶ observed 1-2 °C differences in temperatures at 1.25 metres above the ground in irrigated areas compared to dryland in the area near Rochester, approximately 75 km west of Shepparton.

Question 6: What is your view in relation to technical measures to address heat island effects?

- 58. PV installations shade a portion of the ground and therefore reduce heat absorption in surface soils. Tracking collectors intercept more solar irradiance than fixed arrays, therefore provide shade to the ground under the array.
- 59. Electricity supplied from the PV power station will remove energy. This will reduce the amount of energy that remains as heat in the local area. Commercial PV panels are becoming incrementally more efficient, meaning that more energy will be removed from the PV farm. It is likely that the developers of solar farms will already plan to use commercially available high efficiency panels as that will maximise the income available from the PV farm.
- 60. PV panels are thin and relatively lightweight therefore, have little heat retention capacity per unit area. Consequently, the array temperature will quickly reduce once the sun goes down. PV modules emit thermal radiation both up and down, and this is particularly significant during the day when PV modules are often 20 °C warmer than ambient temperatures.
- 61. Barron Gafford et al postulated that the PVHI "*may be due to heat trapping of reradiated sensible heat flux under PV arrays at night*". Consequently, increasing the amount of radiation heat loss from the ground under the PV panels will reduce the temperatures in the PV field overnight. This can be achieved by turning the PV arrays toward the vertical position overnight to open up the view to the cold night sky to facilitate radiant cooling.
- 62. To indicate the radiative cooling benefit available when 'parking' the array at different angles to the horizontal overnight, I have calculated the area of the ground 'covered' by the array at a range of different angles for the Lemnos site. If the panels are horizontal, they will shield approximately 43% of the sky. When completely vertical they will shield less than 5% of the sky, depending on the bulk of the tracking mechanism. At 45°, 60°, 70° and 80° to horizontal the array will shield approximately 31%, 22%, 15% and 8% of the sky.
- 63. Natural convection will also be facilitated by PV arrays not being held horizontal overnight so that the air near the panels will rise naturally if the panels are hotter than surrounding air. Open spaces under the panels, will facilitate this flow and as the cooler night air is drawn in to replace air that has warmed and risen, the ground will also be cooled. Fixed collectors often have little space left under the panels for air flow. The proposals allow approximately 500 mm of space which will facilitate natural convection cooling.
- 64. Vegetation is often removed from PV power plants. If retained, or replanted, vegetation under the panels will provide an extra heat removal mechanism through transpiration, however, this may require high levels of maintenance that could be impractical. Vegetation surrounding the solar farm will also contribute to cooling through transpiration.

Question 7: Describe any effects of PV arrays on local climate

- 65. The localised climate <u>within</u> the solar farm has been discussed in answering Question5. In answering this question, I will cover impacts that may occur in areas surrounding a solar farm.
- 66. Temperature measurement in the localised area surrounding a solar farm has been reported in the literature only by Fthenakis and Yu⁷.
- 67. Fthenakis and Yu measured temperatures at a height of 2.5 m at a solar farm in Canada within the PV field and at a number of points for a distance of up to 800m from the outside of the PV array. They found that "...air temperatures in the center of PV field can reach up to 1.9°C above the ambient temperature, and that this thermal energy completely dissipates to the environment at heights of 5 to 18 m. The data also show a prompt dissipation of thermal energy with distance from the solar farm, with the air temperatures approaching (within 0.3 °C) the ambient at about 300 m away of the perimeter of the solar farm."
- 68. The following figure is from Fthenakis and Yu. It indicates that the temperature drops quickly within the first 100 metres from the perimeter of the solar farm.




Fig. 8. Air temperature difference as a function of distance from the perimeter of the solar farm. Negative distances indicate locations within the solar farm.

69. The solar farm studied by Fthenakis and Yu was open to the surrounding area with no screening between the PV array and surrounding sites.

- 70. Heat flow from the solar farm to adjacent properties could take place by radiation or by convection. Radiation will transfer heat through empty space where there is a clear view from the hot body to a cooler body. Convection is the movement of a hot fluid to cooler region. It can be natural convection (hot air rising) or forced convection due to air moving across the surfaces by wind or similar.
- 71. Heat flow both by radiation and convection from the PV farm to the surrounding area can be substantially reduced by suitable screening.

Question 8: Describe any temperature change effects on neighbouring orchards

- 72. There are orchards that are near some boundaries of the proposed solar farm sites.
- 73. At Tallygaroopna an irrigation channel is between the solar farm and an orchard. In some other sites the orchards are across rural roads from the solar farm sites. In these cases, the channel will provide a cooling effect and the road reserve will provide an additional setback to mitigate any increase in air temperature.
- 74. The study by Fthenakis and Yu, indicates that temperatures drop very quickly away from the perimeter of the solar farm studied. That solar farm was open to the surrounding area with no screening between the PV array and surrounding sites.
- 75. Natural convection will take the warm air upward, so it will not spread heat into neighbouring properties. Forced convection could move heat from the PV farm to surrounding areas if there is no barrier to reduce air flow. In a mild breeze the influence of natural convection will quickly lift the warm plume upward and in a stronger wind the heat may be spread wider, but temperatures will dissipate quickly as the air is mixed more quickly, diluting the heated air with unheated air. A dense vegetation screen will effectively block air flowing from the solar farm to a neighbouring orchard, thereby reducing the temperature impact from the solar farm.
- 76. Radiation from one surface to a nearby area can be effectively eliminated by 'shading' the cooler area from the hotter one. The vegetation buffers or hedges, proposed in most applications and required in the proposed conditions, will, if higher than the panels, screen the warm panels from radiating to adjacent orchards.
- 77. In my opinion a suitable screen would lead to a substantial reduction of the heat flow both by radiation and convection from the PV farm to the surrounding area.

Question 9: Are there any other effects from the solar farms?

- 78. There are a number of other effects that could occur in a development that requires earth moving during construction, installation of low profile equipment and construction or placement of buildings and power infrastructure.
- 79. **Noise** Tracking solar PV arrays move at an unobtrusive and slow rate, producing minimal noise. Solar PV farms are generally silent during the operational phase. The only noise emitted from an operational solar farm would be from the substation and inverters, which can be inaudible if appropriate buffer distances to sensitive receivers or equipment housing are used. There is no noise from inverters at night due to daytime operation of solar panels.
- 80. Noise impacts would largely be restricted to the construction phase and these could be managed through mitigation measures.
- 81. During plant operations, other minor sources of noise would be from a small number of vehicles accessing the site per day, aeolian and/or corona noise from transmission lines and any intermittent noise from maintenance activities.
- 82. **Dust** The proposals have the potential to generate dust during construction from minor earthworks, construction vehicles driving on unsealed access road and wind blowing over stockpiles and exposed surfaces during construction and decommissioning.
- 83. Impacts due to the generation of dust would be short term. A dust management plan should be prepared as part of the Environmental Management Plan to identify mitigation measures, primarily aiming to suppress dust for each phase of development.
- 84. **Glare** In general, modern PV panels are designed to absorb as much sunlight as possible to convert it into electricity. Studies of PV modules with anti-reflective coating indicate they reflect around 2% of incoming sunlight⁸. The panels are single axis tracking aligned North/South. Consequently, they rotate from facing toward the East in the morning across the sky to facing West at sunset. Under the proposals, the maximum tilt of the panels is 60°. This would not allow reflection onto neighbouring properties under normal operating conditions, as when the sun is at the lowest point any light reflected would be upwards.
- 85. There will be a trade-off between the potential for glare and the desire to have an unimpeded view from the ground to the sky for night cooling. A suitable compromise would be to have the array park at 60 70° overnight.
- 86. **Light spill** In Australia, night lighting on solar farms is limited to the substation and support buildings. Light spill from solar farms at night has not been raised as a widespread issue in Australia.
- 87. It is likely that night time lighting will be installed around the operation and maintenance facilities, carpark and substation. The lighting used should be low-level

and directional to minimise potential for light spill. Possible management strategies would be to include, design to *AS4282 Control of the obtrusive effects of outdoor lighting* or, include requirement that lights be shaded so that no light will spill on any surface above 3 metres. This would ensure that any otherwise obtrusive light would be shaded by the vegetation around the boundary.

Question 10: What can be done to mitigate any possible effects?

- 88. The possible effects of noise, dust, glare and light spill have been discussed with mitigating strategies under Question 9.
- 89. There are a number of options to reduce heat build up within the solar farm and reduce transmission of any heat that is retained into neighbouring properties.
- 90. Heat build up within the solar farm will be minimised by installation of efficient PV panels to transmit more of the incident solar energy out if the site as electricity and by tracking which will intercept more solar irradiation.
- 91. Any impact of heat that may build up during daylight hours can be mitigated by facilitating overnight radiative cooling of the ground by turning the PV array to maximum tilt overnight so that heat can be radiated to the cold night sky from the warmer ground.
- 92. A vegetation buffer may assist with cooling of the solar farm due to transpiration, however it may also reduce cooling winds across the panels during the day. On balance the impact on heat build up within the array will vary from a tendency to increase or decrease depending on the particular conditions at a particular time. However, a vegetation buffer will reduce impacts of radiation to the surrounding area in all conditions.
- 93. Whilst decreasing heat build up will be important to the operator of the solar farm, as PV output reduces as temperature of the panels increase, for neighbours the major issue will be to reduce the potential for heat transmission out of the solar farm into neighbouring properties.
- 94. An effective strategy to mitigate heat transmission out of the solar farm is to provide a buffer of dense vegetation surrounding the solar farm. The vegetation should be visually dense from the ground to higher than the top of the PV array at its highest point.
- 95. In my opinion a dense vegetation buffer will effectively stop heat transmission to neighbouring properties. There will be minimal effect on temperatures more than 100m from the outside of the vegetation.

Question 11: Inform the panel as to your views in relation to the conditions

96. The conditions set out in the draft proposed by the City of Greater Shepparton include conditions covering, screening vegetation, setback and the angle of tilt at which the PV array will be held overnight.

Vegetation screen

- 97. The recommended conditions include that "the landscape plan must include details of permanent screening trees and shrubs with a minimum of six rows using a mixture of local tress and understorey species." and "Once the landscaping planting is carried out the landscaping must be maintained including the replacement of any dead or diseased plants to the satisfaction of the responsible authority."
- 98. In my view this does not adequately define the requirement as there is no specification of the height. The height of the vegetation should be added to the condition so that the screen is in excess of three metres once the plants are grown.
- 99. The conditions should also require that the vegetation screen be planted and maintained along all boundaries of the solar farm.

Setback

- 100. The recommended conditions include that "the solar arrays are set back at least 50 metres from the lands boundary".
- 101. Whilst there is limited data upon which to make a definitive recommendation, in my opinion, if the screening is adequately defined and maintained, then that will provide an adequate buffer to heat flow so that there will not need to be a large setback. In my view this condition could be reduced to a setback of 20 metres from the vegetation screen, or approximately 30 metres from the boundary.

Overnight Array tilt

- 102. The recommended conditions include "The photovoltaic arrays (solar panels) must be orientated so that panels are perpendicular to the ground within 30 minutes of sunset until within 30 minutes of sunrise to facilitate night radiant cooling"
- 103. In my opinion requiring the array to be perpendicular will not be necessary as the vegetation screening will mitigate against heat flow to neighbouring properties if there is heat retained overnight. A tilt angle of approximately 60-70° from the vertical will still facilitate radiant cooling of the array.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Site Description

General Site Description	The site consists of an approximately 150-acre sPower Sierra Solar Greenworks facility (the solar farm), and approximately 7- acre adjacent parcel to the east, also owned by sPower and never developed into a solar farm facility (currently vacant, "the vacant lot").

A Topographic Map showing the approximate site location and a Site Diagram showing the approximate boring locations are included as Exhibits 1 and 2 of Appendix A, respectively.

1.2 Scope of Work

The objective of this limited soil sampling (LSS) was to evaluate the presence, magnitude, and extent of cadmium in shallow soil within the solar farm the adjacent vacant lot. Terracon's scope of work was to collect soil samples and compare any detected cadmium concentrations within the solar farm to any detected concentrations outside of the solar farm. The laboratory reported results were further compared to the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), California Human Health Screening Levels (CHHSLs); the State of Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ); and the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), Region 3 (Mid-Atlantic Region), Regional Screening Levels (RSLs); for residential and commercial/industrial land use.

2.1 Pre-Mobilization

Prior to drilling activities, an Underground Service Alert (Dig Alert Ticket No: A181301231-00A) service was requested by Terracon personnel for clearance of public underground utilities.

2.2 Soil Borings

As part of the approved scope of work, a total of 28 soil borings (B-1 through B-28) were advanced at the site. The soil borings were advanced using conventional hand auger equipment to a maximum depth of approximately 1.5 feet below grade surface (bgs). Soil borings B-1 through B-23 were advanced within the boundaries of the solar farm and soil borings B-24 through B-28 were advanced in the adjacent vacant lot for background concentrations. The approximate boring locations are shown on Exhibit 2 of Appendix A.

Sampling equipment was cleaned using an Alconox^a wash and potable water rinse prior to the beginning of the project and before collecting each soil sample. The materials encountered during sample collection consisted of a sand and silty sand to the maximum depth explored of about 1.5 feet bgs.

2.3 Soil Sampling

Terracon's soil sampling program involved submitting one soil sample from each boring for laboratory analysis. Soil samples for laboratory analysis were collected from each boring at a depth of approximately 1.0 to 1.5 feet bgs. Soil sample depths for each boring are presented together with the soil sample analytical results in Table 1 of Appendix B.

Soil samples were collected in laboratory-provided glassware and placed on ice in a cooler. The sample cooler and completed chain-of-custody form were relinquished to a State-of-California certified laboratory for analysis. Samples were submitted for analysis on a standard 5-day turnaround time.

2.4 Investigation Derived Waste

Due to the relatively small quantity of investigation derived waste (less than 5 gallons), the shallow depth of the borings (approximately 1.5 feet), and absence of field-evidence of impairment, the borings were backfilled with their respective soil cuttings to the surface.

3.0 LABORATORY ANALYTICAL METHODS

The soil samples collected from borings B-1 through B-28 were analyzed for Cadmium by USEPA Method 6020. The soil samples were analyzed by SunStar Laboratories, Inc. of Lake Forest, California, an Environmental Laboratory Program (ELAP) certified laboratory.



The laboratory analytical results for the soil samples are summarized in Table 1 of Appendix B. The complete laboratory analytical report and corresponding executed chain-of-custody form are provided in Appendix C.

4.0 DATA EVALUATION

Laboratory analytical results for the soil samples collected from the solar farm portion of the site (soil borings B-1 through B-3) indicate that cadmium was not detected above the laboratory reporting limits ranging from 0.23 to 0.25 milligrams per kilogram (mg/kg). Analytical results for the soil samples collected from the vacant lot portion of the site (soil borings B-24 through B-28) indicate that cadmium was not detected above the laboratory reporting limit of 0.25 mg/kg.

Screening levels for cadmium concentrations have been established at a regional level by state and/or federal agencies. For this LSS the CHHSLs, the Virginia DEQ, and the USEPA Region 3 (Mid-Atlantic Region) Regional Screening Levels (RSLs); for residential and commercial/industrial land use, were used for comparison to the analytical laboratory results. The reporting limits for the non-detected concentrations in the soil samples collected from both the solar farm and the vacant lot are lower than the aforementioned screening levels for commercial/industrial and residential land use.




5.0 FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- n Cadmium concentrations were not detected above the laboratory reporting limits of 0.23 to 0.25 mg/kg in any of the samples collected from the solar farm or from the vacant lot. Therefore, the solar farm operations do not appear to have impacted soils with cadmium on the portion of the property developed as solar farm.
- n The reporting limit for the non-detected concentrations are at least an order of magnitude lower than any applicable screening levels for residential and commercial land use in the states/regions of California or Virginia.





Supervisor Benton -- regarding your question at the sPower public hearing on March 12 about sPower's soil testing report, I would like to correct one statement that I made. The soil testing report by Terracon did provide the location of the solar plant and the test methodology (see link below). I had not read the report for several months, and I was going from memory.

However, my statements about lack of context by sPower still stand. They have not provided any explanation about why they picked this site for the testing.

- sPower's website indicates the Sierra Solar facility is in Lancaster, CA. It began operating on 30Nov2015 and has a 22.5 MW capacity.
- Soil testing was performed 17May2018.
- Why was this 2-1/2 year old facility selected for the testing?
- What is the history of solar panel damage at this site?
- Did this site have the most breakage of all the sPower sites that contain CadTel solar panels, and therefore has the highest risk of soil contamination?

As I mentioned in my testimony, I am not concerned about undamaged solar panels sitting in a field.

Solar farms are costing North Carolina counties big bucks and land owners also fear having the facilities nearby will impact property values.

"Solar and wind in North Carolina is out of control," state Sen. Bill Cook, District 1 Republican, said.



Carolina counties pay an 80 percent tax abatement for solar farms. Cook plans to introduce legislation that would reduce the tax rebate counties must give solar companies over several years from 80 percent to zero percent.

"They'll have the opportunity to make decisions and not get hit all of a sudden with a huge increase in their property tax," Cook said, adding that he is for renewable and clean energy, but it must be done responsibly.

"If it was an economically feasible thing, that would be great," he said. "But it isn't."

Officials in Beaufort County say their tax loss from solar farms is \$543,000 per year and will go well over \$1 million per year if a planned 600-acre solar farm is built.

"Our taxpayers here are paying for that tax abatement, and they're also paying for an increase in energy costs," said Beaufort County Commissioner Ron Buzzeo.

Beaufort County Commissioners recently voted 4-3 to stop any further construction of solar farms in the county for a year.

Buzzeo also wants to increase the distance solar farms must be placed from property lines from 50 feet to at least 300 feet.

"The landowner who is renting their land has rights, but the landowner who is in the surrounding area, whether it's residential or school or hospitals, also have rights," Buzzeo said.

Three eastern North Carolina counties last year called for an end to local property tax breaks for solar farms, the Virginian-Pilot reported.

Currituck County passed a resolution – and was joined by Pasquotank and Chowan counties – calling on state lawmakers to end the 80 percent tax discount.

The solar tax breaks mean Currituck County receives \$210,600 in property taxes instead of more than \$1 million.

Pasquotank County officials said their county's loss is more than \$420,000 in annual revenue from 508 acres of solar farms.

Chowan County does not have solar farms, but two are approved for construction, Commissioner John Mitchener said.

Perquimans County has three solar farms, but officials have not passed a resolution on tax breaks. Three more solar farms are approved for construction, County Manager Frank Heath said. Commissioners have approached state officials about scaling back the tax breaks, he said.

"It's been a topic of discussion," Heath said.

The Solar Energy Industries Association said in a statement that "Repealing the property tax abatement risks damaging this still growing industry that brings much needed economic development to the state."

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



I am a Livingston District resident and have been attending BOS, Planning Commission, Planning Staff, and Town Hall meetings over the past year. At the March 12, 2019 BOS meeting, comments were made by BOS members that are of great concern to me:

1. **Property Rights. The argument** is **NOT relevant** to the sPower SUP Applications. If landowners wanted to sell their properties within the currently approved zoning use, the BOS and residents would NOT have a say. However, an application to CHANGE the zoning-approved USE for sPower is a game changer. The BOS and resident taxpayers have a RIGHT to voice our opinions, especially when there are long-term financial, environmental, and life/fire/health risks involved.

APPROVAL or DENIAL of the SUP Applications must be made based upon what is BEST for the County and resident-taxpayers, NOT what is best for the landowners and sPower.

2. Common sense due diligence. "Why would the BOS accept and obligate the County to a DECLINING REVENUE STREAM over 35 years as proposed by sPower without at least evaluating Highest & Best Use development alternatives?" is a valid question.

In the sPower Resolution of Approval with Staff Conditions mentioned during the Board of Supervisors' meeting on March 12th, the Planning Staff made a recommendation in section B.2 under Construction that "the Operator shall shuttle at least twenty percent (20%) of the workforce to and from the site during construction." This percentage was reduced from seventy percent (70%), as recommended by the Planning Commission, to twenty percent (20%) on the basis, as explained by the Planning Staff, of inadequate parking spaces for the workforce during construction. Specifically, one supervisor asked where the construction workforce vehicles would park.

Both the Kimley Horn Construction Traffic and Access Evaluation, Feb 16, 2018, revised June 14 2018, and the sPower Traffic Mitigation Plan, December 13, 2018 reference off-site parking locations. The first document makes a statement that workers will be originating their trips from temporary residences (motels). The second references off-site parking opportunities.

"Off-Site Parking: The following off-site parking opportunities in the greater Fredericksburg area and along the I-95 corridor are under consideration:


- **Park and Ride and Virginia Railway Express (VRE) Parking Lots** – VDOT manages six park and ride lots for a combined total of over 5,000 parking spaces in the greater Fredericksburg area. sPower will work with VDOT representatives to identify lots with excess capacity.

- **Private Parking Lots** – Private parking lots with excess capacity during regular business hours may be considered for agreements for temporary parking. Potential locations could include the Spotsylvania Town Center, local churches, or other commercial shopping centers.

Based on the available off-site parking capacity, sPower and the contractor will identify one or more locations as hubs for employees to meet and utilize the encouraged ridesharing opportunities."

A quick review of parking areas within Spotsylvania County malls and industrial areas shows that there are more than enough parking spaces near the I95 corridor to accommodate the sPower workforce during construction. A number of these malls and industrial areas are vacant or underutilized. Their owners would undoubtedly welcome the opportunity to block off a portion of the lots, in exchange for a fee, to accommodate sPower workers during the construction phase.

For example, the parking lot in the Spotsylvania Towne Centre between Macy's and Paragon Village is underutilized with the possible exception of Black Friday and the weeks around Christmas. The areas marked off in red below could easily accommodate 300 to 350 vehicles.



Similarly, the Massaponax Outlet Center suffers from lack of tenants. Thus, their parking lot is rarely utilized. The marked off areas in red could accommodate 100 to 150 vehicles.



Other similar spaces are available elsewhere in Spotsylvania County.

Using these mall and industrial areas would 1) allow the carpooling of construction workers, 2) give a boost to the mall and industrial area owners by charging a fee to cordon off the areas for this purpose and, finally, 3) reduce the amount of traffic congestion along the already congested Orange Plank and West Catharpin Roads.

This simple alternative allows sufficient off-site parking for the sPower workforce during construction. Keep the shuttling of construction workforce at seventy percent (70%).

EDITORIAL: Solar project is too big for Spotsylvania

AFTER meeting with both sides and reviewing reams of docu- ments, we've determined that the rancorous year-long debate over a proposed 6,350-acre solar power plant that has pitted Concerned Citizens of Spotsylvania County, a small local grassroots group, against a large, out-of-state corporation comes down to this: the project is way too big for western Spotsylvania County, and there are too few benefits to county residents to offset this major deficiency.

Utah-based Sustainable Power Group (sPower) wants to turn 10 square miles of agriculturally-zoned land that was previously a tree farm into a forest of solar panels, making it the largest solar facility on the East Coast. The company's plan to shield this utility-sized power plant from view with trees and berms doesn't change the fact that it is massive in scale.

Too massive, in fact, for an agricultural zone that abuts a residential area. Which is why the county's Planning Commission recommended that sPower be given a special use permit to erect solar panels only on 245 acres, the smallest of its three connecting sites and also the one farthest away from homes.

Some objections to the 500-megawatt, \$615 million project, including nearby residents' fears that the proposed solar facility would cause major environmental and health problems during construction and its subsequent 30 years of operation, seem somewhat overblown, and more attributable to a Not In My Backyard attitude that is making it harder and harder to erect needed infrastructure pretty much anywhere.

Both sides have hired appraisers who disagree on what impact the solar farm would have on nearby home values, but it seems beyond dispute that solar panels would be quiet, undemanding neighbors. sPower has also committed to spending \$25 million in community upgrades, including replacing aging water pipes in Fawn Lake, although the company admits that these enticements are not legally enforceable.

But sPower's resistance to posting a cash bond or irrevocable letter of credit to protect Spotsylvania taxpayers from what could be an enormous cost of decommissioning and disposing of 1.8 million solar panels containing toxic cadmium telluride at the end of their useful lifespans if the project's multiple limited liability corporations skip out is troubling. So is its insistence that the supposed future recycling value of the spent panels three decades from now be included in its current decommissioning plan.

Related to the project's massive scale—in an area that is much closer to a residential area than most of the nation's solar facilities of its size—is the fact that sPower has already contracted to sell all of the electricity generated by the proposed Spotsylvania solar facility to power-guzzling tech giants Apple and Microsoft, as well as the University of Richmond.

Microsoft, which already has a data center in Loudoun County, is utilizing tax breaks and a \$1.5 million state grant to expand in Mecklenburg County. The expansion will add 100 more jobs, but they'll all be in Southside, not Spotsylvania.

sPower points to millions of dollars of increased tax revenues the land would generate as a solar plant instead of a tree farm, with no corresponding pressure on county services that a residential subdivision in that same location would create. But a tree farm and a suburban subdivision are not the only options there.

Dr. Dean Bellas of Alexandria-based Urban Analytics, who was hired by Concerned Citizens to analyze the economic impact of the proposed solar farm, noted that "under the sPower proposal, Spotsylvania County will receive declining tax revenues annually on a per-acre basis on an appreciating asset (real estate)."

Bellas concluded that "the forgone tax revenues to Spotsylvania County from alternative development scenarios are substantial... The County would also enjoy larger economic benefits (new jobs, new labor income, and the multiplier effect on the local economy) with less acreage needed."

Bottom line: If Microsoft or Apple were building a new data center in Spotsylvania County and creating high-paying jobs there, a good case could be made for building such a large solar facility alongside to power it. But that's not the case. All of the electricity produced, and most of the jobs the project will support after a brief construction period, will be elsewhere.

Even under a best-case scenario with no adverse impacts on local residents, Spotsylvania County will forgo the possibility of more lucrative economic development in the area for a 30-year deal that will mostly benefit sPower and two of the largest corporations in the world. Property taxes and a \$25 million good-faith gesture are not enough to offset the potential loss of new jobs, future economic development and the increased tax revenue it would bring, and the loss of thousands of acres of agricultural land.

Solar power can and should be part of Virginia's energy mix, but this project is too big and offers too few benefits to the county. The Board of Supervisors should follow the Planning Commission's recommendation and grant sPower a special use permit only on the smallest of the three parcels.

It goes into effect on July 1st and allows counties the flexibility to decide whether or not to count recycling credits for decommissioning of solar facilities. Supervisors,

I understand that sPower is trying characterize pending legislation in the General Assembly (SB1091 – Reeves) as somehow forcing our county to allow salvage value in the decommissioning cost estimate (contrary to the PC and staff recommended conditions). I respectfully encourage you to contact the Virginia Association of Counties (VACO) for the history of this legislation. VACO came out strongly in favor of the SB1091 bill and in fact lobbied on behalf of all Virginia Counties to get the mandatory "shall" language (from the original bill) changed to "may" just so that the counties would have complete leeway to decide whether or not to allow recycling credit. They wanted counties to have the most flexibility because of the unknown recycling market. Here's a release from them discussing the bill while it was under consideration – it's the first item:

Key point from the press release: "Preservation of local authority to negotiate the terms of restoration upon removal solar energy equipment must be maintained." The Stanley bill listed there (SB1398) became part of the Reeves bill.

Lerch is VACO's director of Local Government Policy and very familiar with the bill and VACO's efforts to preserve the counties' flexibility on this issue. Why take away that flexibility because sPower is trying to twist the intent of this bill? There should be no doubt that the county has complete flexibility now and will have complete flexibility in the future.

Quote from SB 1091: "...such estimate shall not exceed the total of the projected cost of decommissioning, which <u>may</u> include the net salvage value of such equipment, facilities, or devices, plus a reasonable allowance for estimated administrative costs related to a default of the owner, lessee, or developer, and an annual inflation factor."

Additionally, I've attached a rough, marked up copy of the sPower (Swinerton) Conceptual Cost Estimate Summary from their latest decom plan. The Estimate is dated 11/15/18. I noted 3 main areas of concern:

- \$8,175,756 claimed net recycling value of the PV modules. Based on their panel quantity of 1,615,762 PV modules, this equates to a claimed recycling credit of \$5/panel. They define recycling as "material will be reconstituted into a new product" so this does not assume that the panels will be sold intact on some secondary market. Of course Swinerton provides no supporting documentation to support a recycling value of \$5/panel. My estimate directly from SPower's recyclers is a \$42M cost. Those details were provided in an email to you on Feb26th.
- Total number of panels is incorrect should be \$1.8M which could affect other values on numbers of foundations etc
- The estimate counts a recycling credit for the foundations, which sPower's GDP indicates would be concrete. That's about \$3.5M for broken up concrete or preformed concrete pads. Really? In a separate part of the decommissioning plan they state that they may use concrete as fill material on site anyway.

There are many other problems with their decommissioning plan – these three are highlights and are related to their claims of recycling credits.

I strongly recommend supporting the Planning Commission and staff's recommendations to not allow recycling/salvage credits in the decommissioning cost estimate. The county doesn't need SB1091 to do it that way, but SB1091 (if signed) supports what the county PC and staff are recommending.
